

SPICER'S DAIRY or WORK SHEETS.**Transcribed by Marilyn England September 2013.**

As Peter Spicer was the Superintendent of convicts at Moreton Bay from August 1826 until the closure of the convict settlement in 1839 his records relate to convicts only. A lot is repetition as outlined below, so it was not included from Spicer's everyday worksheets, only what I thought was most important, for example, the details of **Monday 11 February 1828** below are a once only and are not repeated:

3 Clerks in public office.

3 Overseers at Police duties and with working gangs.

13 assistants do. 12 with working gangs, 1 at Prisoners' Bake and Cook house.

155 Mechanics and labourers. 146 in the Engineers' Department, 9 at the Bay to erect public buildings.

9 Splitters and Fencers. 5 men split 125 rails and posts 2 morticers for 28 5-rail posts, 1 to put up 10 panels 5-rail fence, 1 in charge.

157 Agriculture Establishment. 29 with Boylan at Stradbroke, 44 with McGuire breaking up and stumping, 31 with Wright burning off, 25 with Kelly breaking up, 11 with Ropwland chipping, 6 ploughing and grinding, 9 with punt.

10 Stock keepers and carters. Three with the sheep, 2 with the pigs, 1 with cows, 1 with goats, 1 watching cattle, 2 carters.

17 Light gang. 1 in the store, 2 watchmen, 1 scavenger, 1 dairy maid, 2 water carriers and 10 shelling corn.

18 Camp gang. 13 in Government Garden, 4 minding corn, 1 employed at the stores.

6 Barrack establishment. 2 Bakers, 2 cooks, 2 wardsmen.

24 in Hospital – 3 attendants, 21 patients.

Total workforce 415.

194 floggings in all = 10,400 lashes

There are no floggings listed after October 1828 when
 8x200 were given (see below), even though the
 absconding continued. Did Logan change his methods
 of punishment, or did Spicer no longer record
 floggings?

Did Logan put them in the Mill Gang which was now operating?

On 15/10/28 5 prisoners were given 200 lashes each
And on 16/10/28 3 prisoners were given 200 lashes.

Note that although it was against Sydney regulations Logan used bullocks to plough in November 1828.

On 27th August 1828 The Commandant, Mr. Frazer and Miss O'Beirne and 47 male prisoners went to the Bay to embark on the new schooner *Letitia Bingham* for Sydney.

On 13th October Logan returned from Sydney on the *Isabella*.

The floggings listed below were given 2 days later.

On 3/12/1828 apparently the wheat crop had failed and the settlement goes on half rations of flour.

Miss O'Beirne returned from Sydney aboard the *City of Edinburgh* on 23/1/1829.
